OUTLAW FORCED CHILD MARRIAGE IN NIGER

CAMPAIGN BACKGROUND

Three-quarters of girls in Niger are married before they are 18. Child marriage often amounts to slavery, for example, when girls have not given their free and full consent, are subjected to control, exploited and unable to leave. The younger a child is, the less autonomy they have to give their free consent. By tackling early child marriage in countries where girls are vulnerable to slavery, we can help put an end to forced child marriage and slavery.

An outlawing of child marriage in Niger's national civil code, or law, would send a message to communities, who often turn to traditional justice, that the practice is unacceptable. Furthermore, it could act as a stepping stone for directing further government resources towards education and rehabilitation programs.

By educating the public about the prevalence of forced child marriage in Niger, we can show support for a move towards formally outlawing child marriage, which would complement the Government's existing social programs aimed at educating girls. - Where else in the world do you think forced child marriage happens? Why is it such a global problem?
- What can the international community do to help put an end to forced child marriage in Niger?
- How can we, as a group, get the word out about the Freedom United 'Forced Child Marriage in Niger' campaign?
