Modern slavery is used to describe situations when a person is involuntarily exploited through mental or physical threats or abuse for someone else's benefit. They are controlled by an 'employer', dehumanized and treated as a commodity or bought and sold as 'property'. Restrictions are placed on the person's freedom of movement through threats, confiscation of legal documents or physical restraint.

We are all involved and, most importantly, we can all do something to stop it. By being part of an active social movement to end modern slavery we can use our voices to collectively demand change within society, business and governments towards a world in which modern slavery no longer thrives.

An estimated 21 million people are trapped in forced labor around the world. But countries have an opportunity to protect workers by ratifying the 2014 Forced Labour Protocol.
